

What's Charge Conference and who can vote for 2019?

The United Methodist Church's website has a glossary of Methodist terms, this is the definition of a Charge Conference: "The charge conference is the basic governing body of each United Methodist local church and is composed of all members of the church council. All members of the charge conference must be members of the local church. The charge conference must meet at least once per year. The charge conference directs the work of the church and gives general oversight to the church council, reviews and evaluates the mission and ministry of the church, sets salaries for the pastor and staff, elects the members of the church council, and recommends candidates for ordained ministry." If you refer to the August Newsletter, Meg on Methodism featured more information about what the Administrative Council is and does. For review, the voting members of Charge Conference are the members of the Administrative Council.

Who's on Administrative Council for 2019?

This information is directly from paragraph 252.5 but I added the parentheticals with who is serving at First this year. The membership shall include but not be limited to the following:

- a) the chairperson of the church council; (Bob Drake)
- b) the lay leader; (Steve McDonald) c)the chairperson and/or a representative of the pastor-parish relations committee; (Jason Taylor)
- d) the chairperson and/or a representative of the committee on finance; (Sarah McMaster)
- e) the chairperson and/or a representative of the board of trustees; (Joe Navaro)
- f) the church treasurer; (Sue Hughes)
- g) a lay member to annual conference; (Bobbie Dove)
- h) the president and/or a representative of the United Methodist Men; (Bill Haslett)
- i) the president and/or a representative of the United Methodist Women; (Linda Haslett)
- j) a young adult representative
- k) a representative of the United Methodist Youth;
- 1) the pastor(s). (Pastor Meg Cook)

Note, this year we are hosting a Neighborhood Charge Conference with Gordon Memorial UMC and Bethel UMC. Our District Superintendent describes the purpose of a Neighborhood conference as: To unite in worship and fellowship, and to learn from one another about effective ministry. Our Charge Conference is October 8th at 6:30pm in the sanctuary.



The Communicators for Christ Conference is Friday-Saturday, Oct. 4-5, at Rosewood Church, 2901 Rosewood Dr, Columbia. It is for students 6-18 and adults.

This conference is the best thing I know we have available this fall to help our students understand that they can and they must communicate well when they identify with Christ. 
The 22nd Annual Rock Around the Clock will be held on October 4 and 5 this year. Come out and support this festival!

The Blessing Box Ministry is in its 3rd year of helping the less fortunate citizens of Fairfield County. Thanks be

to God and to the wonderful, faithful partners in this ministry.

What began at First United Methodist Church in March of 2017 offering 25 boxes of household necessities has grown to offering 80 bags of these items. During the last 6 months we have given bags to 449 Fairfield County households.

We have transitioned from cardboard boxes that the ministry had to purchase to reusable "Blessing Box" totes that recipients bring back each month to be refilled with paper bags donated by Bi-Lo.

While our committee is very proud of the success of the Blessing Box Ministry, it's continued growth is taking a toll on our resources. We will be seeking new partners and sponsors in the coming months. If you have any suggestions for finding such resources, please encourage them to join us in our efforts to improve the daily lives of our neighbors in Fairfield County.

The cost of filling a single Blessing Box bag is about \$18.00, so we are asking for your continued support in the form of prayers, participation and donations.
